UPH Inaugurates 2289 Graduates and 70 Medical Doctors

In the end of the 2017/2018 Academic Year, UPH held the XXXIII Graduation Ceremony to inaugurate 2289 graduates with Diploma 4, Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctorate degrees. The ceremony was attended by Dr. Ir. Illah Sailah, MS. Association of Indonesian Private Universities Sector III Coordinator. In her speech, she reminded all attendees that currently, all graduates are verified and that it can be confirmed online. Thanks to the excellent management on UPH's behalf. She also reported that among the UPH graduates, 50 of them secured a government scholarship

UPH graduated students from 41 departments – two Diploma 4 programs, 28 Bachelor's programs, and 11 Master's programs. These graduates consist of 306 Bachelor of Education (S.Pd.) graduates, 173 Medical School Bachelors (S.Ked.), 278 Bachelor of Nursing (S.Kep.), and 199 Sarjana Terapan Pariwisata (S.Tr.Par.), along with 247 Master's graduates from 11 study programs. The graduation was held for three days – May 31, June 2, and June 9, 2018, at UPH Grand Chapel. Dr. Ir. Illah Sailah, MS. – Koordinator Kopertis Wilayah III, Dr. (HC.) James Riady, UPH founder, and Dr. (HC.) Mochtar Riady, founder of Lippo Group, all gave their speeches in sending the graduates on their journey.

70 Medical Doctors Declared their Doctor's Oath

Universitas Pelita Harapan Faculty of Medicine (FK UPH) inaugurates 70 medical doctors of the XXXI batch on Thursday, April 26, 2018. The inauguration was held at the UPH Medical Campus, at the Siloam Lippo Village Karawaci region. The procession was led by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine – Prof. Dr. dr. Creativity as a Key to Success

“Developments in technology are able to change humans’ lives. We used to walk on foot, but now we can cover long distances with newly-invented modes of transportation. Currency, something that used to only be a means of transaction, is now really important in our lives – it can even be a weapon in economical battles.

We can also learn from the success story of Jack Ma, who invented payment systems via our smartphones through alipay. Indonesia should be proud and can learn from Dr. Mochtar Riady’s success story – when he developed a number of banks that manage to become large brands like Panin Bank, Bank Kemakmuran, Bank Buana, and Bank BCA. This is a valuable lesson for students to learn from, in their road towards success. It needs 50 years to develop a bank and to make it truly successful.

He possesses a skill that other bankers do not have – money flow. In addition, he is the first Indonesian to establish a bank overseas. What is the key: creativity. When running a business, you need a large capital – and this is not about money. You need to have a creativity, which will set us apart from other people around us.”

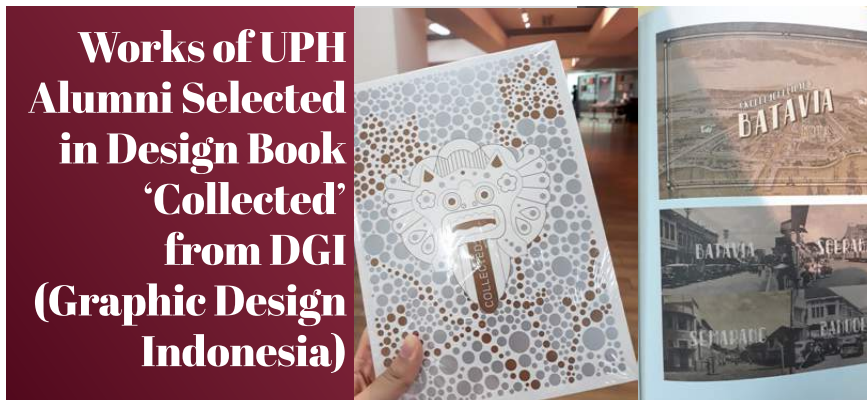

3 Know the Target Audience



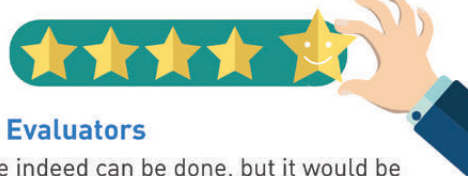
Relax and recognize the audience. Do not think too seriously when speaking in public, because it will make you nervous. With that mindset, it will help you to be more relaxed when conveying the materials
